Key Information

- Please can children bring in a pencil case containing the following only: pencils, a blue writing pen, a green biro for editing, a glue stick, scissors and a ruler (please try and name items)
- Homework is set weekly on Mondays and is due back the following week and will include: Maths (MyMaths), Reading Comprehension, SPAG/Spellings
- Children will need to read 20 minutes daily and complete quizzes regularly on Accelerated Reader.
- Your children can use Times Table Rock Stars at home to practise the times tables and ensure they know them.
- PE days for Term 1 are Wednesday (indoor) and Thursday (outdoor)
- Please can your child come in wearing appropriate named uniform for school – stud earrings only, black shoes/trainers



Attendance

School target of 97%

- There are 190 days that children should attend school each year
- 5 days off a year will give a child an attendance of 97%
- Children should attend school with coughs and colds
- Medical evidence will be asked for excessive absences relating to illness
- No holidays, birthdays or trips away can be authorised
- Punctuality is being monitored more closely this year
- Meetings with senior leaders will take place if low attendance or poor punctuality
- Penalty notices (fines) are issued for excessive unauthorised absence
