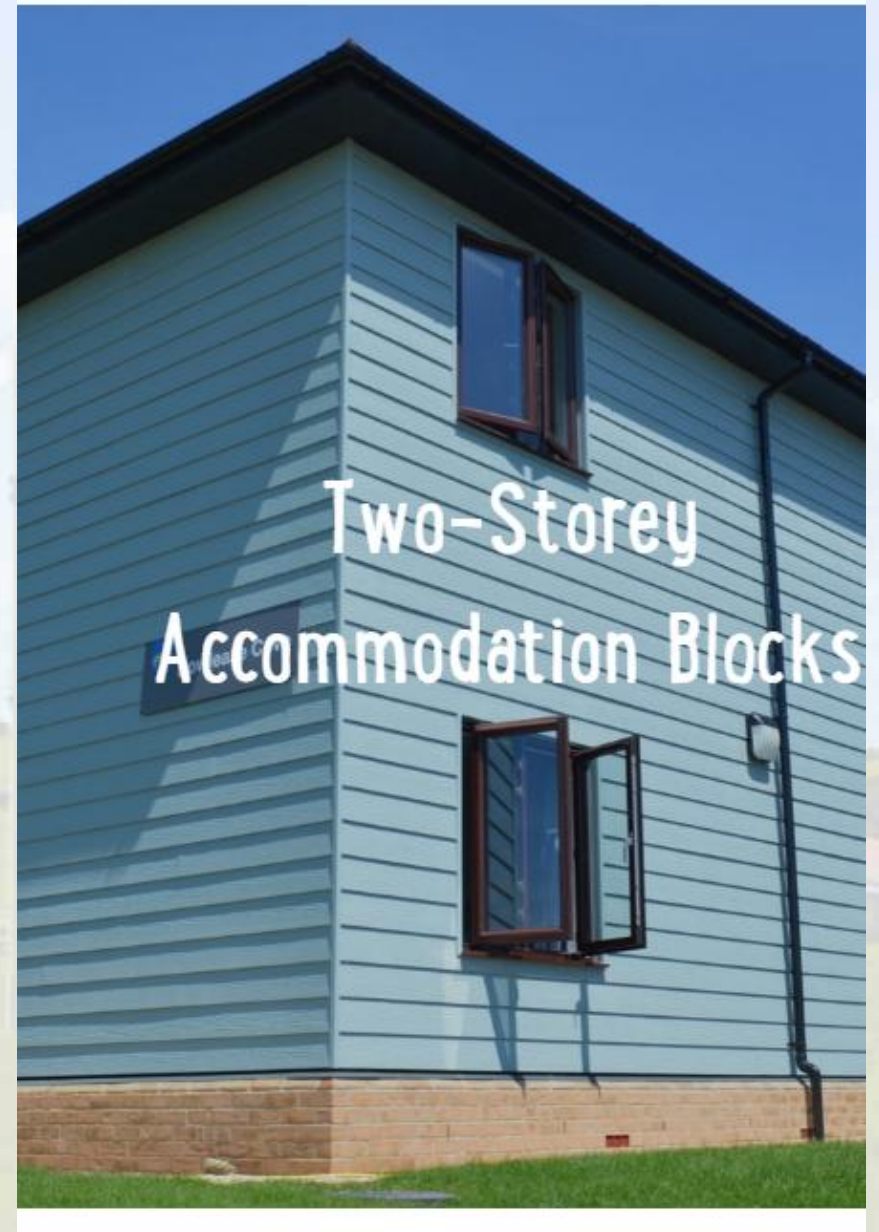

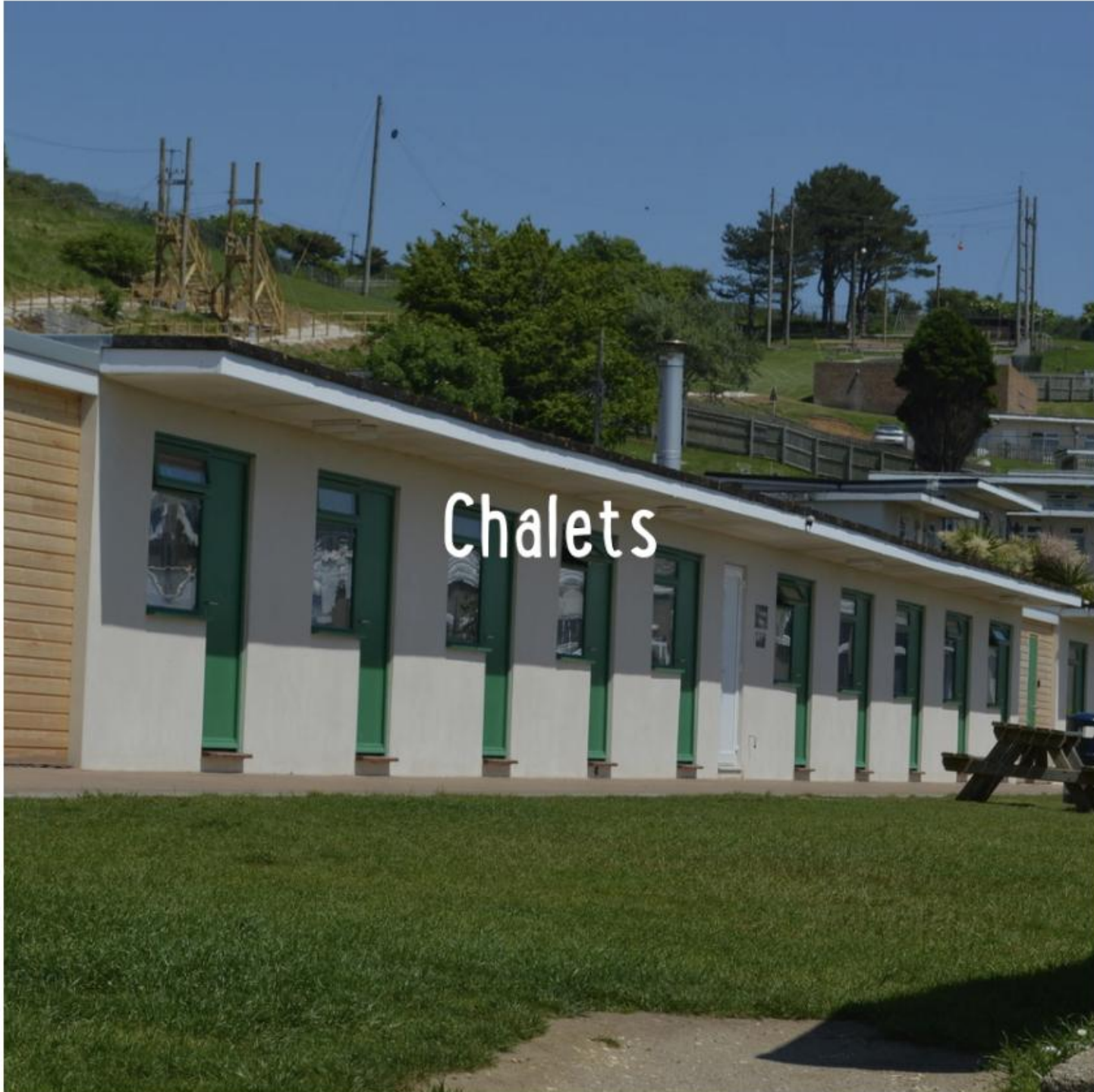

CLOTHING

Kit :

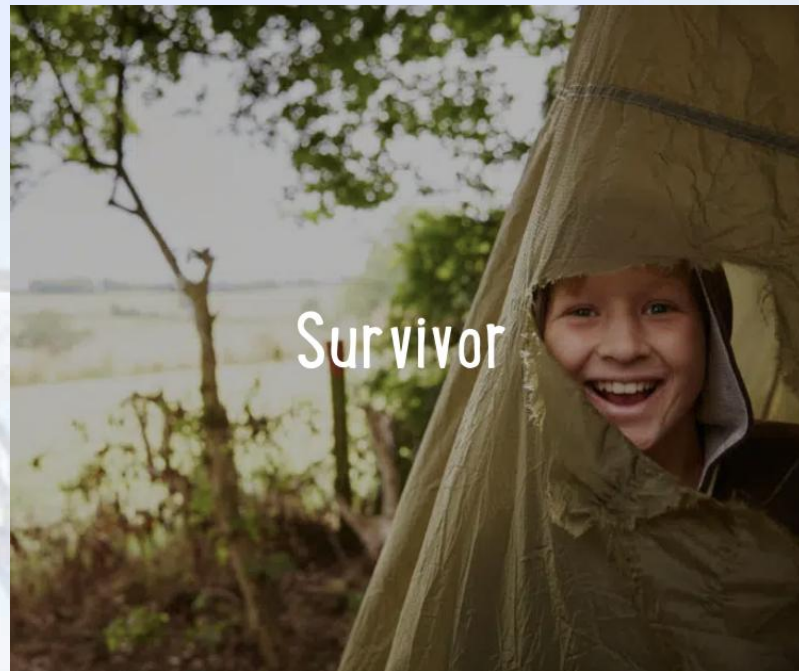
- **Pack extra changes of clothes**
